Background

Framework

One travel and study scholarship will be made available annually by the Marine Stewardship Council (MSC) for unrestricted research on Global fisheries management.

Qualifying projects will:

Have the objective of studying some aspect of environmental improvement, performance or best practice in fisheries management. This may be direct study of one particular fishery or comparative study of fisheries problems or management. Direct linkage to a fishery certified or wishing to become certified by the MSC is not a requirement, although this is an additional point of interest for the MSC.

Objective

To support the study of the problems, solutions and performance of best practice in fisheries management and fish product supply chain management.

Scope

Travel and project support up to a limit of £4000. In exceptional circumstances more may be granted.

Eligibility

Qualifying proposals shall be from undergraduate or postgraduate students worldwide.

Requirements

The project must be completed within 12 months from the start date stated on the application form. The final monitoring report and project summary document must be submitted within 15 months from the start date stated on the application form.

Evaluation

All applications will be initially assessed on comparable scoring criteria. A maximum of five applications of the highest scoring applications will then be submitted for evaluation by the MSC scholarship award review panel. The MSC Director of Standards reserves the right for final decision of the scholarship award.

Your application will be acknowledged with 1 week of the closing date. If you do not hear from the MSC within that time, you should contact us immediately.

All applicants will be informed of the outcome of their application within 6 weeks of the closing date.
