The minimum size of the ASC label on pack is slightly larger than the MSC ecolabel. However, when both are to be placed side by side on a product, the ASC label should be scaled down slightly to minimum height of the MSC ecolabel.

Horizontal Label Usage

When used in a landscape setting the heights of both labels should be the same when stacked horizontally. When vertically stacked, labels should use the same width.
