By attending the MSC's Seafood Futures Forum, all attendees agree with the following code of conduct to ensure a safe and enjoyable environment for everybody.

The Code of Conduct:

The [MSC's Seafood Futures Forum](#) is dedicated to providing a discussion and debate about the future of sustainable seafood, which we appreciate can be passionate and lively.

We do not tolerate harassment of anyone in any form.

Harassment includes (but is not limited to) any offensive verbal comments related to gender, gender identity and expression, age, sexual orientation, disability, physical appearance, body size, race, ethnicity, religion, technology choices. It also includes indecent or offensive images, deliberate intimidation, stalking, following, harassing photography or recording, sustained disruption of talks or other events, inappropriate physical contact, and unwelcome personal attention.

If an attendee engages in harassing behaviour, the organisers may take any action they deem appropriate, including warning the offender or expulsion from the forum.

If you are being harassed, notice that someone else is being harassed, or have any other concerns, please contact a member of the MSC team immediately. Members of the MSC team will be easily identifiable and be happy to help attendees contact hotel/venue security or local law enforcement, provide escorts, or otherwise assist those experiencing harassment to feel safe for the duration of the forum. We value your attendance.

We expect attendees to follow these rules at fora and workshop venues and related social events.
